Our sessions have been focused on getting young people into the habit of Bible reading to take the next steps in their relationship with God. We usually have between 5-10 eleven to seventeen year olds attend each week, excited for a time of fun and games with close friends and eager to grow in their relationship with God. I've had the opportunity to lead small groups during our devotion time which has filled my heart with so much joy getting to walk alongside young people in their faith journeys. I am so thankful to God for the opportunity to share Jesus with them and watch them grow spiritually.



I have had the opportunity to help out at our incredible bookshop and cafe Kingsley & Co this term. It's such a magical and breathtaking place, full of many quirky things for children and families to explore. This term Kingsley launched their new baby and toddler group called Story and Rhyme which has been very popular with families in the community. I've had the opportunity to lead story and song time as well as interacting with little ones and their families. When I'm not helping at Story and Rhyme, you'll find me organising the many genres of secondhand books we have for sale for only £1 or making one of our famous coffees. We also have regular visits from schools, recently during World Book Day I dressed up as Tick-Tock the crocodile from Peter Pan whilst helping Year 1's read and choose books to take home with them. Bet I've never seen a reading crocodile I hear you ask yourself! I have thoroughly enjoyed working at Kingsley and cannot wait to see how God uses me in the future here.

Easter Assemblies

The other week Luke, Neil and I had the opportunity to go into a non-faith based secondary school local to Ykids, to share an Easter assembly to each year group throughout the week. We shared about Jesus being the Living Water and that Jesus is all these young people need to satisfy them. We played "Gargle It", the young people watched a video we created, and Luke shared a short gospel message. It was a great learning experience for me learning how to evangelise in a local school and I thoroughly enjoyed the experience.
